Field weekend 6, kindly sponsored by Fishbites.com was a ‘local boundary’ weekend.

Woah!! Hello Summer!!! Wow, finally a great weekend all round.

Weather really put it all on for us this weekend and the seas played their part too. Although certain areas northwards fished really well, it seems that locally was the place to be. With Whirinaki firing up on the snappers leading up to the weekend and well into, Whakaki also joined in with snapper and gurnard.

Blucks Pit Road was hit and miss. Fired up Saturday morning but left the rest of the day and Sunday morning with nothing more than empty beer cans and bait bins.

Fish weighed were: 20 Kahawai, 59 Snapper, 32 Gurnard, 13 Smooth Hound, 1 Trevally, 1 Blue Moki and 1 kingfish.

Eight pin fish were weighed – Ian Lopdell with a 7.515kg Snapper, Hamish and James Parahi both landing twin Gurnard at 1.01kg. James Parahi got the only Moki weighing in at 3.6kg. Kane landing a 5.39kg Smooth-hound and a 5.69kg Snapper, lastly was a Trevally of 2.51kg that was caught by Karim, who also weighed a Kingfish of 8.395kg.

Prizes went to:

Estella – Average Kahawai 1.89 (1.88 was the average weight)

Ian – Snapper 7.515kg, Hamish & James P – Gurnard 1.01kg, Karim – Other-Kingfish 8.395kg. No Jnr prize, so this went to James P for his Gurnard.
